OVERVIEW

Since its inception in 1991 and after a two-year hiatus from 2009, the University of Miami School of Law proudly announces once again the reinstatement of its **LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM** in Session 2 of our Summer Abroad Programs in 2012. The second session of the program an exciting three-week segment called the **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** will again be presented at Bentham House, the Faculty of Laws building at University College London ("UCL"). Located centrally in the Bloomsbury district of London, UCL offers an ideal living and learning experience for the study of law abroad. In previous years approximately 35 students from all over the United States participated in the **LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM** in Session 1 and 75 students in the **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** in Session 2. Of these students a combined total of 45 were from nineteen law schools other than the University of Miami School of Law. Students from over 120 different law schools have attended previous programs in London. It is anticipated that 2012 enrollment will be approximately 40 students in Session 1 of our **LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM** and 80 students in the **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** in Session 2.

The **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** second session will begin on July 23 and end on August 13, 2012. All students must enroll in both Sessions 1 and 2 for a total of six credits and will participate in exciting and informative excursions. Each student will have the option of choosing one of two Summer Abroad Programs offered in the first session—the **LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM** offers two 3-credit courses of which the student will choose from in Session 1—or, the student can choose to enroll in one required 3-credit course offered in the **GREECE & ITALY PROGRAM** in Session 1. All students must enroll in one course from an offering of two 3-credit courses in the **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** in Session 2 from July 23-August 13, 2012. Courses will be taught by members of the faculty of law from the University of Miami School of Law and distinguished universities in the United Kingdom.

Single room accommodations arranged in self-catered flats of up to 5 rooms around a kitchen/dining room and bathroom are provided in Schafer House residential hall, a modern UCL dormitory opened in 1995. Schafer House is located on Drummond Street in Central London, approximately a 10 minute walk to Bentham House UCL Faculty of Laws school building where classes will be conducted.

The **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** is one of the best located, most comprehensive and most inclusive summer abroad programs. An exciting array of special events and guided tours are included at program expense.

Following the conclusion of the **LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM**, and the **GREECE & ITALY PROGRAM** in Session 1, an 8-day intersession is scheduled during which students may take advantage of an optional 8-day French Optional Intersession Tour presented by Contiki Holidays, the world's largest travel company for 18 to 35 year olds, or travel to European destinations on their own, before continuing with the **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** in Session 2 from July 23-August 13, 2012.

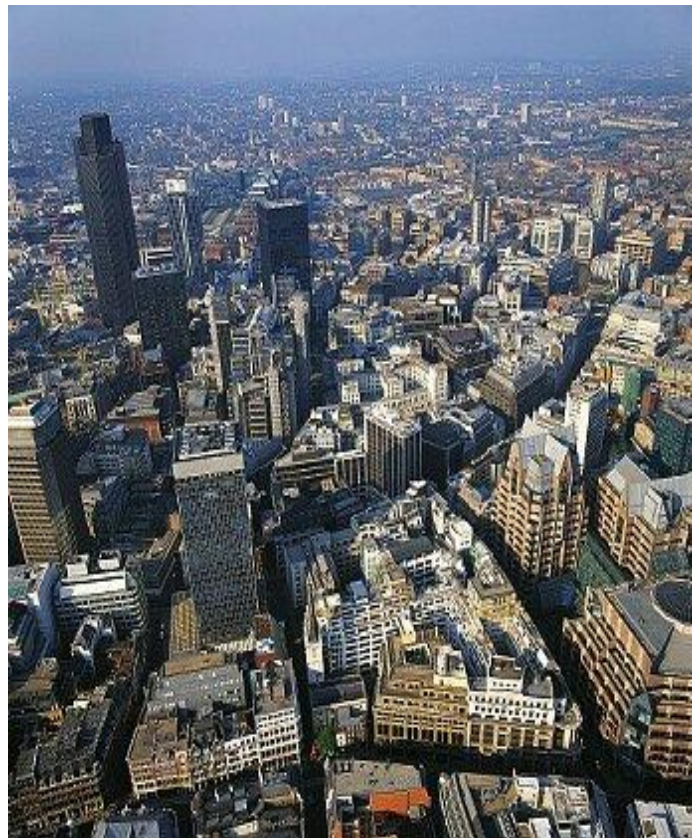
ABOUT BENTHAM HOUSE, UNIVERSITY COLLEGE LONDON

All classrooms utilized at UCL have been remodeled and air-conditioned. The Faculty of Laws at UCL is international renown as one of the best law schools in the United Kingdom.

LONDON CULTURE AND RECREATION

London's many cultural attractions are a mere walk away from campus, making travel and access simple and inexpensive. The city caters to a wide variety of entertainment as well, serving up everything from rock, raves and jazz, to the latest stage productions offered at more than 50 theatres. The West End, close to the campus, offers more than 20 theatres, the Royal Opera House, the National Gallery, and the National Portrait Gallery. The open-air market of Covent Garden and the lively Soho area, with its pubs, restaurants, and nightclubs are a pleasant stroll away. Whether you seek to see its modern side or explore its famous past, your stay in London will surely be an experience you'll never forget.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Students enrolled in the LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM in Session 2 must also enroll in one of two Summer Abroad Programs in Session 1; either one choice of two 3-credit courses offered in the LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM from June 24-July 16, or a required 3-credit course offered in the GREECE & ITALY PROGRAM, June 21-July 16.

Upon return of the 8-day intersession, July 16-23, an organizational meeting prior to classes for students to pick up their course materials will be conducted on the first day of class on Tuesday, July 24, followed by a mandatory UCL orientation in the afternoon shortly after class. Students who participated in the London Summer Program in Session 1 are not required to attend the UCL orientation meeting after classes. Twelve additional classes, each of 160 minutes duration with the exception of a one hour Plenary Lecture Session on July 31 where classes are 160 minutes in duration and the last four classes are 165 minutes duration, are scheduled in total between July 25 and August 11, 2012. Examination will be scheduled Sunday, August 12th, from 2:00 to 6:00pm. The program ends Monday, August 13th.

All courses comply with the standards of the American Bar Association and the Association of American Law Schools.

Students should contact their present law school regarding the possibility of accelerated graduation, and, where appropriate, converting semester credits to a quarter system.

Upon completion of the 2012 LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM, Session 1, and LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM, Session 2, an official transcript from the University of Miami will be mailed to the student's law school and confirmation will be mailed to the student's current mailing address. The University of Miami employs an A+, A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D and F grading system. The transferability of credits will be determined by the student's present law school. Inquiry should be made in advance of application.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Any student in good standing at a law school who will have completed one year of academic work prior to June 30, 2012 is eligible to enroll in the program as are law graduates. Students attending a law school other than the University of Miami School of Law will be required to furnish a *letter of good standing* from their home school before Program commencement. The University of Miami School of Law reserves the discretion to request additional information evidencing the applicant's suitability to attend any of the Summer Abroad Programs offered.

Enrollment is limited. Applications, accompanied by the \$250 registration fee and guarantee tuition deposit of \$750 the latter to be credited against tuition expenses, including a passport size photo or similar must be received by March 31, 2012. Applications are available in the brochure or by downloading it on line at www.law.miami.edu/summerabroadprograms.

Applications received after the March 31st deadline, which are accompanied by the registration fee, guarantee tuition deposit, photo, and payment(s) then due will be considered subject to space and accommodation availability.

COURSES

STUDENTS SELECT ONE OUT OF TWO COURSE OFFERINGS

INTERNATIONAL SALES LAW (3 Credits)

Professor Robert E. Rosen, University of Miami School of Law. This course will examine leading cases, legislation and other materials from the legal traditions within Europe, with a focus on English, French and German law as the main representatives of those traditions. Materials are chosen and ordered so as to foster comparative study. Topics include formation, validity, interpretation, supervening events, remedies and consumer protection laws. A course in U.S. contract laws is a prerequisite.

THE OLYMPIC GAMES & THE LAW (3 Credits)

Professor Jill Pilgrim, Principal & Business Counsel, Precise Advisory Group. The course is designed to provide law students with an in depth understanding of the Olympic sports framework and the myriad of parties, legal and political issues that arise in this context. The powers and authority of the International Olympic Committee vis-à-vis National Olympic Committees, International Federations, National Sports Federations and athletes, will be explored and explained. Legal issues related to managing Olympic sport organizations will be studied, as well as the role of governments and politicians in Olympic sport.

THE FACULTY

JILL PILGRIM, principal and business counsel of Precise Advisory Group, has built a national reputation as a prominent sports lawyer. Her distinguished career includes decades of experience working in the sports business and corporate environments, serving as an attorney, arbitrator, entrepreneur, international consultant, speaker, and published author of several legal articles in national academic and trade publications. She is the former general counsel of the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) and USA Track & Field (USATF), the national governing body for track and field. She has spent 33-plus years in the Olympic sports world: eight-and-a-half years as general counsel and director of business affairs for USATF; 10 years as a volunteer for USATF; and more than 15 years as an athlete. Pilgrim received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Politics from Princeton University in 1980, where she also was a nationally ranked sprinter

for the Princeton Track and Field Team, and studied at the Alliance Française and Sorbonne in France prior to graduating with a J.D. from Columbia University School of Law in 1984.

ROBERT ELI ROSEN, Professor of Law at the University of Miami, received his A.B. and J.D. from Harvard University and M.A. and Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of California-Berkeley. As a member of the Working Group on the Comparative Studies of Legal Professions, he has worked with other international scholars to examine the globalization of law practice. In addition to Comparative Contract Law, he has taught Administrative Law, Contracts, Advanced Contracts and Business Associations.

COURSE MATERIALS

All courses will be self-contained. Books and other required materials for the courses will be distributed at the organizational meeting scheduled on the first day right before classes start on Tuesday, July 24, in the Main Lecture Theatre at UCL Faculty of Laws, Bentham House, in London. All courses will be taught in English.

PROGRAM EXCURSIONS

The **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** in the second session incorporates a ride on The London Eye and boat cruise on the River Thames.

THE LONDON EYE RIDE The London Eye welcomes an average of 3.5 million people every year. It took seven years and the skills of hundreds of people from five countries to make the London Eye a reality. You can see around 25 miles from the top as far as Windsor Castle on a clear day. It can carry 800 passengers per revolution and each of the 32 capsules weighs 10 tons. Each rotation takes about 30 minutes and allows passengers to stop on and off without the wheel having to stop.

RIVER THAMES BOAT CRUISE. There is no better way to see many of the landmarks of London than from the River Thames. See London from a different perspective. A Thames river cruise is without doubt one of the best ways to see London, weaving through the heart of the city and past so many of its most famous attractions. We will take you to experience the sights and splendour of this great city from the relaxed comfort of modern, all-weather boats with open upper decks and spacious lower

saloons with panoramic windows. Highlights include the site of the Cutty Sark, Canary Wharf, the Tower of London, Tower Bridge, the retired battle-cruiser—HMS Belfast; St Paul's Cathedral, Shakespeare's Globe and the Tate Modern. From the boat you get a closer view at Millennium Footbridge, controversially built for the turn of the new century; and of course Westminster Abbey and Big Ben, both recognized worldwide as iconic buildings of London.

TWO THREE-DAY WEEKEND BREAKS

Two three-day weekend breaks have been incorporated into the LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM from Friday, July 6, through Sunday, July 8, and Friday, August 3, through Sun, August 5, for self-directed travel so that students can explore Scotland, Ireland, Amsterdam, Paris, etc., on their own.

ACCOMMODATIONS

The educational experience in London will be steeped in legal tradition, but the accommodations will feature all the comforts and convenience of contemporary London. Students will reside at UCL Schafer House situated on Drummond Street in central London, a 5-10 minute walk from Bentham House, UCL Faculty of Laws building where classes will be conducted. Opened in 1995 this self-catered residence has 364 single rooms arranged in flats of up to 5 rooms around a kitchen/dining room and a shower room with toilet.

Each bedroom is fully carpeted with a hand basin and equipped with an internet socket (internet available at a fee). Bed linen and bath towel are provided and rooms are serviced weekly. On site facilities include a common room (TV room), laundry/drying, ironing, hairdryer, fridge freezer, cooking, microwave, guest garden or patio, and barbeque facilities, as well as elevators and public telephone.

There is easy access to the West End, London Theatres and Oxford Street, just a 20-minute walk away or accessible by bus. There are numerous restaurants to suit all budgets and tastes in nearby Charlotte Street and Drummond Street. Local shopping facilities are close by and three mainline stations are within a 5 to 10 minute walk. Regents Park with its beautiful architecture, London Zoo and Open Air Theatre is a short walk away from Schafer House.

TRANSPORTATION

Students attending the 2012 LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM in the second session who are making their own travel

arrangements and not participating in the French Optional Intersession Tour arranged by Contiki Holidays during the intersession, July 16-23, are expected to make their own air travel arrangements to London, England, to arrive on Monday, July 23rd, for commencement of the LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM. Early travel arrangements are essential as London is a very popular tourist destination and will be hosting the 2012 Olympics.

During the intersession period from July 16-23, students in the LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM first session participating in the Contiki Holidays French Optional Intersession Tour must make their own air travel arrangements to arrive on Monday, July 16, in Nice, France, and make their own way to the designated hotel to begin the Contiki Holidays French Optional Intersession Tour.

Moreover, students not participating in the Contiki Holidays French Optional Intersession Tour during the intersession are expected to make their own housing and travel arrangements for self-directed travel. Housing accommodations are not included. However, students desiring to stay in London at UCL Schafer House during the intersession, July 16-23, must contact our Summer Abroad Programs Office to make a reservation. Space is very limited and will be on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Be sure to include in your travel arrangements departure for return home from London at Programs' end on Monday, August 13, 2012.

Students are responsible for arranging their own ground transfers to and from all airports and for arranging flights between Session 1 and Session 2 (if applicable) as designated in the program schedule.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

It is each participant's responsibility to have a valid passport and all visas, permits and certificates required for all Summer Abroad Program destinations. U.S. citizens need only a valid passport. Other nationalities should consult a travel agent or contact the Consulate Office of the country or countries being visited to inquire about visa entries and how to obtain them. Additionally, before departure to England all students will be provided a Confirmation Letter by the University of Miami which is required to present to U.K. Customs officials upon arrival in London certifying participation as a visitor student to study abroad at our host school—University College London Faculty of Laws in London.

HEALTH AND TRAVEL INSURANCE

In accordance with the University of Miami Law School requirements and the American Bar Association rules, all students participating in a summer study abroad program must obtain and provide proof of health insurance that provides reimbursement for health care abroad for the entire duration of the program and should consult their home school or current insurance policy to determine health insurance eligibility. In addition, students are strongly advised to consider purchasing travel insurance that covers trip cancellation or interruption.

If you do not have the required health coverage or wish to obtain optional travel insurance for travel abroad, the University of Miami School of Law suggests that you apply at time of application. For a complete description of purchasing medical protection/health insurance, travel insurance coverage, travel accident protection, worldwide emergency assistance and travel deals and discounts, these websites—www.isecard.com, www.statravel.com, or www.ISICus.com—can help you through the process with complete terms, conditions and exclusions.

In addition, all students who are traveling abroad on a University of Miami trip must register with Red24 Emergency Evacuation website at: <https://www.red24.com/affiliate/chartis/um/>, which is a required mandated University of Miami policy. The link can also be found in myUM under Online Resources. Students must input their entire itinerary including all locations traveled. Should the itinerary change at any time prior to and/or during the trip, the changes must be updated in the Red24 website.

A copy of the Foreign Travel Insurance Form must be printed and carried by the student while traveling. The form can be found here: <https://www6.miami.edu/travel/International-Travel/Foreign-Travel-Insurance.pdf>.

Students who require travel medicine consultation and/or immunization should schedule an appointment at the Student Health Service or other medical provider at least six weeks prior to travel.

Any student who does not register with the Red24 program prior to travel will not be authorized to travel. Also, failure to

comply with this policy may lead to the non-recognition of credits by the University of Miami for courses taken abroad.

DISABLED STUDENTS/SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS

The 2012 LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM will generally be accessible to individuals with physical and learning disabilities. Given that we are visiting other cities in the U.K., special accommodations requests must be made at the same time of application to permit time for evaluation.

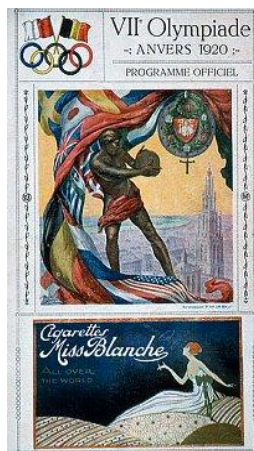
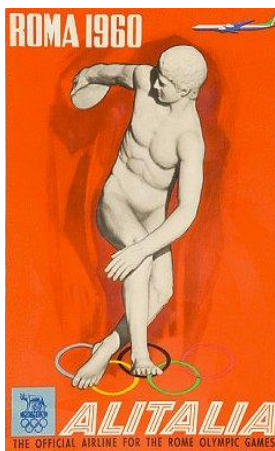

STUDENT LOANS/FINANCIAL AID

The financial aid budget available for the 2012 SUMMER ABROAD PROGRAM segments is adequate to meet all your financial needs associated with your summer study of law abroad but it is not generous. The Staffords are still at \$8,500 Subsidized and \$12,000 Unsubsidized per year. The interest rates are at 6.8%, but may change next July 1st. In addition to the federally regulated Stafford loan, students can also apply for a Graduate Plus loan, which together fund the full cost of the program. The Grad Plus, would cover any difference between the student's Staffords up to the budget cost of the program. The Grad plus interest rate is at 7.9%. The Graduate Plus loan is also a guaranteed federally regulated loan employing the same processing system as the Stafford loan. Both loans should be applied for at the same time, if needed.

All Miami students eligible for student loans may apply on line at www.law.miami.edu/finaid. All students must complete a FAFSA at www.FAFSA.ed.gov before considering applying for loans. Upon registration full details will be provided by the Financial Aid Office of the University of Miami School of Law. Applications for financial aid must be completed by the end of March 2012.

All visiting students must apply through their home school and check with their financial aid office regarding processing of consortium agreements, loans, and check disbursements in order to ensure timely disbursements of funds.



All registration fees, tuition and housing costs for all programs in Session 1 and Session 2 including the 8-day iConfiki Holidays French Optional Intersession Tour must be paid for in full before commencement of the Programs in Session 1.

HOW TO REGISTER AND APPLY

An Application Form obtainable from our brochure or available by downloading online from our website at www.law.miami.edu/summerabroadprograms must be completed and submitted to the Summer Abroad Programs Office by mail (if paying by check) or fax at 305-284-9119 (if paying by credit card) with the required deposits and photo.

At the time of your application, if paying by check or money order, make check payable to the "University of Miami School of Law" for USD\$1,000: (1) for the \$250 application fee, and (2) for partial tuition deposit of \$750 for both Sessions **or** (3) USD\$1,250 to include the tour deposit if enrolling in the French Optional Intersession Tour. Payments may also be made by a major credit card and must be included at the time of application. A passport size photo or similar (headshots only) must also be included with your application.

Once your application with the required deposit(s) and your photo has been received, the University of Miami School of Law Summer Abroad Programs office will mail you a confirmation letter and your program details.

Students applying near the program deadline should contact the University of Miami School of Law Summer Abroad Program office to confirm that there's space on the segment(s) you have chosen.

Visiting students in accordance with ABA rules must also have their home school provide the Summer Abroad Programs office with a Letter of Good Standing before Program commencement.

ALTERATION IN PROGRAM

A great deal of effort has been made into the production of this brochure. The information given and literature produced has been compiled with care and is published in good faith. Sometimes, because of circumstances outside our control, some itineraries might have to be slightly altered. If this is necessary, alternative schedules will be arranged and every best effort will be made to advise students accordingly.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE

APPLICATION

A non-refundable one-time registration fee of \$250 and a deposit of \$750, the latter to be credited against Tuition and Related Expenses, or a total of \$1,000 must be received with your application along with a passport size photo or similar by the **March 31, 2012 deadline**. If enrolling in the French Optional Intersession Tour an additional \$250 tour deposit must be included in your payment.

PAYING THE BALANCE

For **students on financial aid**, by **April 23, 2012** an additional non-refundable \$750 tuition deposit and \$250 tour deposit if enrolled in the French Optional Intersession Tour must be made as a guarantee by check or money order, made payable to the "University of Miami School of Law" **or** with a credit card as a guarantee against late cancellation. You must fill out the credit card information on your application form at time of registration. Your credit card will *not* be charged the additional deposit requirement then due pending your financial aid application unless you cancel from the program for whatever reason prior to program commencement. With respect to disbursement of financial aid loans, it will be the visiting student's responsibility to make all necessary arrangements through their law school's financial aid office to ensure that final payment for all monies due will be paid before commencement of the program. Otherwise students will be automatically dropped from the program for nonpayment and may incur a \$125 penalty fee for reinstatement.

Moreover, financial aid funds typically aren't dispersed by the lender(s) until just prior to Program commencement. Please be aware that students should be prepared to pay up front airfare travel and other travel associated expenses prior to receiving financial aid funds.

For **students not on financial aid** by **April 23, 2012** an additional non-refundable tuition deposit of \$750 and \$250 if enrolled in the French Transition Intersession Optional Tour will be required payable by check, cash, money order made payable to the "University of Miami School of Law", or by credit card.

By **May 25, 2012** final payment for **students not on financial aid** for all monies due will be required for the Programs enrolled in both sessions, as well as the intersession French Optional Intersession Tour, if applicable. **If paying by check, all payments should be mailed to: University of Miami School of Law, Summer Abroad Programs Office, Law Library–Room G362, P.O. Box 248087, Coral Gables, Florida, 33124-8087.**

The foregoing payments made to the University of Miami School of Law in April are totally non-refundable. The Summer Abroad Program operates like and with a travel company and like any travel company it and the travel company are committed to numerous non-refundable expenses. Moreover, travel and housing as well as the enrollments are strictly limited. Students who cancel late prevent other students from enrolling in the programs.

The payment deadlines indicated above will be strictly adhered to. Failure to make the additional \$750 payment by April 23rd will result in the student being treated as having withdrawn from the program. All prior deposits made will be treated as forfeited.

Payments received in April will be refundable only if an applicant is for any reason refused admission or if a course offering is changed or cancelled.

ENROLLMENT

Enrollment in the LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM, Session 2, is limited. Students will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Registration deadline for all University of Miami School of Law Summer Abroad Programs offerings is March 31, 2012.

CANCELLATION OR TERMINATION OF PROGRAM

The LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM in Session 2 is being offered subject to change or cancellation by the University of Miami School of Law depending on sufficient enrollment and availability of faculty members.

If cancellation of the LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM, Session 2, occurs after a deposit has been paid, the program director will use his best efforts to make arrangements for each student enrolled to attend a similar program, if the student so desires. If the LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM in Session 2 is cancelled for any reason, all monies advanced by the student will be refunded within twenty-one (21) days after the date of cancellation.

CANCELLATION BY STUDENT PRIOR TO MAKING FINAL PAYMENT

Notice of cancellation must be made in writing to the University of Miami School of Law Summer Abroad Programs office. The tuition deposit [excluding the \$250 registration fee] made at time of application will be refundable for cancellations made in writing and received by the University of Miami School of Law Summer Abroad Programs office by email or fax **before the March 31st deadline.**

All deposits will be non-refundable for cancellations received after the March 31st deadline for whatever reason. No exceptions!!!

CANCELLATION BY STUDENT FOLLOWING MAKING FINAL PAYMENT

Students who have paid in full who voluntarily withdraw for good cause shown following the making of final payment in which they are enrolled including the intersession will receive a refund equal to partial tuition and related expenses of \$4,500 only.

SWITCHING SEGMENTS

Students may enroll in either the **LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM** or the **GREECE & ITALY PROGRAM** offered in Session 1. All students are required to enroll in the **LONDON "OLYMPIC" PROGRAM** in Session 2. **Due to all aspects of the Summer Abroad Programs involving logistics, planning and preparation, there will be no program switching in Session 1 after the March 31st deadline.**

COMPUTER ACCESS/LAPTOPS

At UCL Schafer House Residence Hall each room is equipped with ethernet socket. Cables will be provided, however, there may be an additional fee for internet connection. Students will need to bring their own a/c adapters for the U.K. which can be readily purchased in London. Wi-Fi is not available in the residence hall.

Access will be made available to the computer clusters at Bentham House and any public cluster room at UCL. Internet cafes are also located near to the residence halls.

Laptops/notebooks are cumbersome, possess a risk of being lost or stolen, etc. Students should exercise their own discretion in bringing laptops. Laptops/Notebooks will not be required for class participation.

There are no telephones in the student rooms. Two coin or credit card operated telephones are located in the residence hall lobby.
