For students interested in this area, the basic courses total 12 credits. However, students should take the first four courses of the related courses in their second year for background. Careers in this area split somewhat between processing rights and litigation. This is particularly true in the patents area. In fact to appear before the patent bar requires a separate bar examination and qualification. Further Patents and Copyright practice is also often split. Patent Law is not necessary for a traditional copyright practice.
