



SUMMER ABROAD PROGRAMS OVERVIEW
— SIX CREDITS TOTAL —
June 9 to 12 through August 2 to 5, 2008

The University of Miami School of Law specifically designs its summer abroad programs to be the best located, longest, most comprehensive and most inclusive.

An exciting array of fun destinations, weekend trips, a 4-day Aegean Cruise plus special events and guided tours are included at program expense.

The 2008 Summer Abroad Programs consist of two sessions each containing three unique segments. Each student is required to enroll in both sessions choosing one segment from each session. Session 1 segments begin early June and end July 4. A single 3-credit course is offered in each of the three segments in Session 1. Session 2 segments begin July 13 ending early August. A single 3-credit course is offered in the Italy & Greece segment while students may choose one of two 3-credit courses in the other two Session 2 segments. A total of six credits will be awarded. The courses are designed to offer students an appreciation of the interrelationship of legal systems and cultural aspects that will help them become a successful attorney in the twenty-first century.

Our 2008 Summer Abroad Programs for the first time gives the student the option of selecting any one of three exciting programs in Session 1, in combination with any one of three exciting programs in Session 2. Students seeking the most travel in terms of both time and distance may opt for *LEAP* (England/France/Netherlands) or a comprehensive tour of Iberia provided by the Tour de España in Session 1 followed by Italy & Greece in Session 2. Students who would prefer a somewhat shorter travel experience culminating with three weeks in either Barcelona or London, Session 2, can start off with Greece & Italy, Session 1. Other combinations are possible such as staying entirely in England with the exception of fun weekends in Paris and Amsterdam or spending a full summer immersed in wonderful Spain and Portugal by following up the Tour de España (Session 1) with Barcelona (Session 2). Select by courses desired, location, amount of travel, length of program, variation in cost, etc. Mix and match to suit individual preference.

An 8-day break period, July 5-12, has been incorporated between sessions so that all students can explore other parts of Europe on their own or participate in an Italy Optional Trip exclusively arranged and offered by Contiki Holidays, the world's largest travel company for 18-35 year olds. Students must make their own air travel arrangements to and/or from the Italy Optional Trip to participate. The break period does not include housing or transportation.

All courses are taught by faculty from the University of Miami School of Law and distinguished universities in the destination countries.

All courses are taught in English.
