LAW REVIEW-MOOT COURT CHALLENGE

The University of Miami Law Review and the Charles C. Papy, Jr. Moot Court Board recognize the importance of giving back to the community. The Law Review-Moot Court Challenge was established in 2012 out of this joint commitment to service and doing good in the community. Each year, the organizations challenge each other to log more pro bono hours than the other. The Challenge culminates at the Public Interest Recognition Ceremony, where a three-foot gavel, known as the Gavel of Giving, is awarded to the winning organization for the following year.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION

Alexandria Cinney, Equal Justice Works Fellow, Miami Law Children & Youth Law Clinic.

In 2022, Alex was named a 2022 Greenberg Traurig Equal Justice Works Fellow. Her fellowship will prevent the unnecessary removal of children by providing direct representation to parents and caregivers before an investigation has taken place or before a petition for removal has been filed. She will advocate for families confronted with eviction, domestic violence, and public benefits matters, enabling them to continue caring for their children safely within their homes. She will collaborate with local parent-led advocacy groups to amplify community and parent voices within the child welfare system.

2024 HOPE PUBLIC INTEREST AWARDS

EXEMPLARY SERVICE AWARD

This award is presented to a student who has gone above and beyond in the provision of services to those most in need. The students are selected based on the following criteria: commitment to addressing unmet needs of the poor, demonstrated commitment and leadership through service, and individuals who choose their involvement in ways to promote access to justice for those living in poverty.


